Your Writing Task

For this assignment, you will create a Literacy Narrative, an account of how reading has a ffected your life. Go beyond the simple narrative—include memories and images that will help the reader to become part of your world. Think about cause and effect. What did you learn about yourself? Why was that significant?

Mechanical Details

Length: Minimum 1300 words not counting title, your name, etc. That's about a four-page paper. There is no maximum, but try to keep it under 1950. Papers significantly under the minimum (90% or less) will not receive the best possible grade.

Format: Standard MLA format. (12-point Times Roman type, double-spaced, 1" margin all around, MLA header.)
